Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Although this year has already been crazy enough for the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, we expect further and perhaps deeper impact from the pandemic. We have already suspended Home Visits because of the safety of our Vincentians and of those we serve. There was an increase in food pantry services demand. We stopped meeting in person. We closed our soup kitchen temporarily. We shut down other special works and services that involved personal contact – which, being Vincentian, is almost all of them. Yet we also adapted. We found new ways to get food to people, and rent and utility payments to suppliers, with little or no personal contact beyond the telephone. “Curbside” and “Delivery” became an everyday word and method of service. Our food pantry is open for delivery on Tuesdays and Thursdays, please call St. Josephs SVdP at 401-258-5773 for deliveries. Our Conference meetings re-started with Zoom calls. With an eye to a very near future of expected large increases of rent and utilities requests, we need to think, and perhaps think differently about how to help those in need.

SVdP has a client who lost a washer and dryer in the flash flooding we had here in Newport during July. She is on disability and cannot afford to buy a new set. 
